Most Excellent Companion C. Ralph Lawton was born at Saint John, New Brunswick on November 28, 1911, the son of W. P. and Henrietta Lawton and educated in the schools of Saint John graduating from Saint John High School in 1929. He served in the Royal Canadian Air Force from 1942-1945 and on discharge joined the firm of H. C. Lawton Electrical Limited as Vice-President and General Manager.

Married on October 29, 1951 to Eden Scott Craft.

In Masonic activities he was made a Master Mason in Saint John's Lodge in 1942. He was exalted to the Holy Royal Arch in Carleton Chapter No. 1 in 1946 and was elected First Principal in 1957 and became First Grand Principal of New Brunswick in 1960. Preceptor of Saint John DeMolay Preceptory in 1947. Thrice Illustrious Master of Carleton Council No. 3 in 1960. Director of Luxor Temple A.A.O.N.M.S. in 1964. Honorary Past Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter of Scotland in 1961.

He is a member of the Church of the Good Shepherd, Saint John West. A charter member of the Kinsmen Club and a charter member of the Lions Club and member of Saint Andrews Curling Club.

Special Convocation

Held in Fredericton, N. B. in the Masonic Temple,
October 28, 1967, A.I. 2497

The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of New Brunswick assembled in Special Convocation at the Masonic Temple, Queen Street, in the city of Fredericton on the 28th day of October, 1967 at 3.30 P.M.

The Officers of Grand Chapters of Maine and New Brunswick entered and were introduced by M.E. Horace Pratt and M.E. Waldo Leeman.

Ex. Comp. W. A. Davis, First Principal of Fredericton Chapter No. 2 extended a hearty welcome to the Officers of the Grand Chapters on behalf of Fredericton Chapter.

The M.E. First Grand Principal and Officers of Grand Chapter assumed their stations.

Grand Chapter was duly opened in Ample form at 3.30 P.M. o'clock. Most Excellent Charles E. Fisher, Grand Z presiding. The Grand Scribe E read the Proclamation for which this Special Convocation had been called.

M.E. Charles A. Cross, Grand Z of the Grand Chapter of Massachusetts was introduced by M.E. R. D. Baird and presented the American Flag on behalf of the Grand Jurisdictions of Massachusetts and Rhode Island.

Companion Kenneth Robb, Grand Organist was presented to the First Grand Principal, who conferred the Honorary title of Very Excellent on Comp. Robb for his faithful services over the past years as Grand Organist.

V.E. Comp. Robb thanked Grand Chapter for the honor conferred on him and stated that it was always a pleasure to serve Grand Chapter in that office.

Grand Chapter recessed. A Banquet was served by the members of Fredericton Chapter No. 2, assisted by the Ladies of the Order of the Eastern Star.

M.E. Charles A. Cross spoke on the Order of Demolay Program for boys 15-18 years of age and the impact they had on the future, social and fraternal.

Grand Chapter reconvened.

At this time the First Grand Principal requested the officers of the Grand Chapter of New Brunswick to vacate their stations and the officers of the Grand Chapter of Maine assumed the stations vacated by the officers of the Grand Chapter of New Brunswick, and conferred the Most Excellent Master Degree on: 5 candidates from Mount Lebanon Chapter No. 3; 2 candidates from Botsford Chapter No. 7, and 6 candidates from Fredericton Chapter No. 2, after which the presiding First Principals of these chapters thanked the Officers of the Grand Chapter of Maine for conferring the Degree on their candidates.

Wright explained to Grand Chapter that if no invitation was received from the Subordinate Chapters that Grand Chapter automatically met in Saint John, N. B., after which the motion that the invitation from Campbellton Chapter No. 11 be accepted was passed.

Moved by R.E. C. R. Lawton, Seconded by R.E. R. J. Coy that Grand Chapter recess at 12.00 noon and reconvene at 2.00 P.M. and the first order of business be the Election of Officers. Passed.

The First Grand Principal requested the Minutes of the Eightieth Annual Convocation be read, moved by M.E. Ronald D. Baird, seconded by R.E. R. J. Coy the minutes be confirmed as printed in the Proceedings. Passed.

During the period under review, the usual dispensations were issued for changing the place of meetings, changing dates of meetings and holding special convocations.

I also approved changes in the By Laws for Mount Lebanon Chapter No. 5. It was my privilege to appoint several of our Companions as representatives of other Grand Jurisdictions near the Grand Chapter of New Brunswick and to approve and sign commissions for Grand Representatives near Sister Grand Jurisdictions.

I received many invitations to attend annual Convocations of other Grand Chapters but due to time and distance, was unable to accept them all. I did, however, attend the annual Convocations of three of our Grand Sister Jurisdictions and was warmly received and extended every courtesy.

During the year, I made an official visit to every Chapter in our jurisdiction and also several fraternal visits. On these occasions, I presented commissions and chapter jewels and on four occasions I installed the officers of the Chapters. I also had the privilege of presenting a 50-year jewel to Companion L. S. Morrison of Fredericton Chapter No. 2. On all visits, with one exception, I was accompanied by V. Ex. Companion W. A.
