STANLEY BERNARD CASSIDY

Stanley Bernard Cassidy was born on March 7th, 1912 at Clover Hill, Kings Co., N. B., now known as Cassidy Lake, the son of the late Allen and Edith Cassidy. He received his early education at school in Sussex and then on to the University of New Brunswick to receive his B.Sc. in electrical engineering and his M.Sc. in communications.

His career started with Radio Station C.F.N.B., now Radio Atlantic, in 1937 staying with them to 1946 then leaving as Chief Engineer. At this time he started in business for himself as an electrical contractor which he is still operating under the name of Stan Cassidy Ltd., Fredericton, N. B.

He is a member of St. Paul's United Church of Canada in Fredericton and at present is serving as a member of the Board of Trustees. Other offices held are as follows: Past President Professional Engineers of N. B., Past Vice-President Engineering Institute of Canada, Past President Associated Alumni of U.N.B., Member of Board of Governors of U.N.B., President Provincial Artisans of New Brunswick, Chairman of Board Forest Hill Rehabilitation Centre, Member of Board of Bio-Engineering Institute, Past President New Brunswick Hospital Association, President Maritime Hospital Association, Member of President's Committee of Employment of the Handicapped, Washington, D.C.

The Grand Chapter of the Royal Arch Masons of New Brunswick**SPECIAL CONVOCATION****Held in the City of Bangor, Maine, U.S.A., in the Masonic Temple****Saturday, October 28th, A.D., 1972, A.I. 2502**

The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of New Brunswick assembled in joint Special Convocation at the Masonic Temple in the City of Bangor, Maine, U.S.A., as guests of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of that State.

In the afternoon of the date in question the members of the executive of the Grand Chapter of New Brunswick met in a room adjacent to the Chapter room. While this meeting was in progress Chapter was opened by Mount Moriah Chapter No. 8 of the Grand Chapter of Maine. Officers of the Grand Chapter of Maine and some Companions of the Grand Chapter of New Brunswick then entered, the Grand Chapter of Maine officers assumed their respective stations and after very brief ceremony the Chapter was recessed until 7:30 in the evening.

At 8:00 p.m. the Companions and their ladies assembled at a buffet style banquet in the dining hall of the Temple. Blessing was asked by Rev. George S. EDMUNDS, Grand Chaplain, and a delicious repast was enjoyed by all. In due course the head table was introduced by M. Ex. Comp. Kenneth L. BOOBER, Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter of Maine. The last introduction was that of the guest speaker, Comp. Dr. Harold L. CHUTE, Past Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Maine. Dr. CHUTE, a veterinarian and native of Nova Scotia, was well received, particularly by the Canadian Companions present. The introductory remarks of M. Ex. Comp. BOOBER, though brief, set the stage perfectly for Dr. CHUTE's address. Dr. CHUTE's remarks covered events experienced by him as an immigrant to the United States, as Grand Master of the State of Maine and of his extensive travels in connection with his work. His address was most interesting, warm and touched with humour and occasioned the response of resounding applause from the Companions and their ladies.

After the banquet and its speaker had been enjoyed the Companions once more repaired to the Chapter room, Chapter was again called on and the officers of both Grand Chapters entered. After M. Ex. Companions BOOBER and Ralph T. HALEY, Grand High Priest and First Grand Principal of the Grand Chapters of Maine and New Brunswick, respectively, had assumed stations in the East the remaining officers of these Grand Chapters were introduced

alternately. The officers of the Grand Chapter of Maine were introduced by M. Ex. Max E. PLACE, while those of New Brunswick were introduced by M. Ex. Waldo Y. LEEMAN.

The introductions having been completed, the gavel was assumed by M. Ex. HALEY at the invitation of M. Ex. BOOBER. The furniture of a Most Excellent Master's Lodge was then set up within the Chapter. M. Ex. HALEY pointed out that as this was only an exemplification of the degree it was not necessary to close Chapter to open a Most Excellent Master's Lodge. Under the direction of M. Ex. HALEY the officers of the Grand Chapter of New Brunswick then proceeded to exemplify the Most Excellent Master's degree. A highlight of the degree was at its completion, when the charge to the candidate was given by M. Ex. Wilfrid Laurier MACDONALD, Past First Grand Principal of the Grand Chapter of Quebec. M. Ex. HALEY remarked that M. Ex. MACDONALD had been totally unprepared to present the charge until invited to do so on the spot, yet his presentation had been most impressive. The remark was heartily concurred with by all.

M. Ex. HALEY then returned the gavel to M. Ex. BOOBER, who called M. Ex. Ben BUTLER to the dais to conduct further ceremonies. M. Ex. BUTLER then asked the Grand Captain of the Host to present M. Ex. Companions C. Ralph LAWTON of New Brunswick and Millard WHITNEY of Maine to the East. M. Ex. WHITNEY then presented the Grand Chapter of Maine Ben ELA medal to M. Ex. LAWTON, the latter having been absent from the ceremonies when the original presentation of the medals had been made at Edmundston, N. B., a year earlier. M. Ex. Waldo Y. LEEMAN then presented M. Ex. HALEY to M. Ex. BUTLER, also to receive a Ben ELA commemorative. This was followed by a special presentation of another of the commemorative medals to M. Ex. Comp. Frank A. Van IDERSTINE, Past Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter of Nova Scotia. M. Ex. HALEY was then asked to again preside over Grand Chapter, and M. Ex. BOOBER received the Grand Chapter of New Brunswick Ben ELA medal from M. Ex. LEEMAN. M. Ex. HALEY then had M. Ex. BOOBER and M. Ex. Van IDERSTINE conducted to the east in turn, and presented each with a diploma honouring them with the rank of Past First Grand Principal of the Grand Chapter of New Brunswick.

On the conclusion of the above described presentation of honours M. Ex. HALEY recognized M. Ex. ROWELL of the Grand Chapter of New Hampshire. After this distinguished Companion had spoken briefly the Grand Chapter was closed with the reading of a charge by M. Ex. Charles E. FISHER. The Companions then repaired to the White House Lodge for a social evening.

Held in the Masonic Temple, St. Stephen, N. B.

A.D. June 16th, 1973, A.I. 2503

The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of New Brunswick assembled for the eighty-sixth Annual Convocation in the Masonic Temple in the Town of Saint Stephen, N. B., on Saturday, June 16th, 1973. The Companions having assembled, the Grand Principals entered, assumed their stations and Grand Chapter was opened in ample form. Guest escorts then assembled and retired to the anteroom.

It was then moved by V. Ex. J. A. W. Ramsay, seconded by M. Ex. N. W. Astle that the First Grand Principal be empowered to change or add to the agenda. Carried.

All distinguished Companions from other jurisdictions and concordant bodies were invited to take places in or near the East. When the Most Worshipful

the Grand Master was presented he was conducted to the East and M. Ex. HALEY invited him to assume the chair. This he declined to do, commenting that he understood we had an active slate to attend to, and then accepted a seat immediately to the right of the First Grand Principal.

The pedestal was then veiled and the Mayor of St. Stephen, Douglas HANSON, was conducted into the Chapter and presented by his friend, Ex. M. RICHARDSON. He was welcomed by M. Ex. HALEY and conducted to the East. He spoke briefly, bringing the greetings of town council and the citizens of St. Stephen. After this he was conducted out of the Chapter, the pedestal unveiled and labour continued in ample form.

After the reading of the Proclamation it was moved by M. Ex. W. Y. LEEMAN that Grand Chapter recess at noon, to be called on again at 2 P.M. with the first order of business being the election of officers. Seconded by V. Ex. J. A. W. RAMSAY and carried. The First Grand Principal then extended a general welcome to all Companions present.

On roll call of officers all responded except the Grand Pursuivant, Grand Historian, Grand Organist and Grand Standard Bearer No. 2.

V. Ex. C. W. LOBBAN reported that R. Ex. Sid J. HORTON had been very disappointed that he was unable to answer his name as a Grand Representative. He further stated that Comp. Horton had recently lost his wife. He then moved that a letter of sympathy be sent to Comp. HORTON from Grand Chapter expressing our condolences. This was seconded by R. Ex. J. M. WILSON and carried with heartfelt unanim-

ity. The Grand Representatives were thanked for their presence and reminded of their very important role in Grand Chapter by the First Grand Principal R. Ex. J. M. WILSON responded.

V. Ex. Rev. Donald F. HODDINOTT then conducted the divine service in his usual capable manner, for which he was thanked by M. Ex. HALEY. M. Ex. FISHER then moved, seconded by M. Ex. ASTLE that the thanks of Grand Chapter to our Grand Chaplain be made official and entered in the records. Carried.

A preliminary report of the Credentials Committee then indicated an even one hundred Grand Chapter members, Companions and visitors present, after which the First Grand Principal gave a brief report on luncheon and banquet arrangements. He stated that a forty passenger bus had been made available for transportation purposes by Comp. John R. MUIR.

At this time several guests were called upon to speak, in addition to those who had already spoken. This concluded, Grand Chapter recessed, the hour of high twelve having arrived.

The Companions then repaired to The Canadian Legion hall, where they were met by their ladies and all enjoyed an excellent luncheon. An active and efficient transportation committee insured that no one lacked a ride to the Legion hall or the different motels.

At 2 P.M. Grand Chapter was called on again, and after a brief ceremony in which a certificate of honorary membership was presented to M. Ex. As the hour for election had arrived the First Grand Principal directed the Grand Scribe "E" to read the nominations. Grand Scribe "E" did so, noting that there was but one nomination for each elective office, except that of Grand Principal Sojourner. Grand Scribe "E" then moved that as this was the case

that the scrutineers be directed to find one ballot cast for each office where there was only one nomination, and that a ballot then be taken for the office of Grand Principal Sojourner. This was seconded by M. E. LAWTON and carried. The First Grand Principal then directed Grand Scribe "E" to read those sections of the Constitution pertinent to the election of Grand Chapter officers. This being done the scrutineers were obligated and found one ballot cast for each elective office, other than that of Grand Principal Sojourner. A ballot was then taken for the last named office. On a call for correspondence Grand Scribe "E" reported none pertinent to the assembled Convocation, other than a few letters of regret that had been received from some Grand Chapter Companions. At this time the First Grand Principal also reported that he had received several phone calls in a similar vein.

On the matter of annual grants, it was moved by M. Ex. W. Y. LEEMAN and seconded by Ex. C. H. GRIFFITH that the usual annual grants be made. Carried. The matter of a grant to the host Chapter was raised, but the First Grand Principal advised that the said Chapter had already decided to remit this grant, and this was confirmed by the presiding First Principal of the Chapter, then present. A motion to pay the grant had been made by M. Ex. C. E. FISHER and seconded by R. Ex. J. M. WILSON, but on the above information being given the mover and seconder agreed to withdraw the motion.

At this point several more distinguished visitors were called upon for a few remarks, terminating with a short address by the Most Wor-

shipful the Grand Master, Comp. the Hon. J. Stewart BROOKS. Also about this time two more Companions from Nova Scotia arrived, namely M. Ex. Comp. W. Marshall BLACK, Grand Recorder of the Supreme Grand Council, Eastern Jurisdiction of Canada, Royal and Select Masters, and R. Ex. Comp. Rupert H. MacNEILL, Grand King of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Nova Scotia.

All other business of Grand Chapter having been concluded for the present we now entered upon the installation of Grand Chapter officers, a task most ably undertaken, as it has been for some years past, by M. Ex. W. Y. LEEMAN. In an impressive ceremony R. Ex. Companion Stanley Bernard CASSIDY was installed as First Grand Principal of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of New Brunswick for the ensuing year. At Most Excellent Companion CASSIDY'S invitation M. Ex. LEEMAN continued with the installation, being assisted by the other Past First Grand Principals present. A full list of installed and appointed officers appears in the front of this book, immediately following the First Grand Principal's biographical sketch.

Upon completion of the installation ceremonies Grand Chapter was closed in ample form. The Companions again repaired to the Legion hall, there to be met by their ladies. After a pleasant repast we enjoyed a sparkling address from our guest speaker, our M. Ex. Comp. Rev. Daniel C. MacKENZIE. After the banquet had ended the Companions gathered at the Wandlyn Motel to enjoy the incoming First Grand Principal's reception, dispersing to their homes later that evening or the following morning. Our labours thus commenced in order were conducted in peace and closed in harmony.
