

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

JOHN ALBERT ROGERS First Grand Principal of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of New Brunswick

John Albert Rogers was born the 20th Jan. 1911, at Gray's Mills, Kings Co., N. B.

He is married to the former Willa M. Hubbard, Cassills, Northumberland Co., N. B.

They have one son and one daughter.

He graduated from MacDonald Consolidated School at Kingston, N. B. in 1929, was commissioned in the reserve army in 1932. Served six years on active service, during the second world war, landing in France on the 10th of June 1944, as Second in Command of the 10th Ind. Support Group (N. B. Rang.), was discharged from active duty 20th Oct. 1945.

Moved to Sussex, N. B. in October 1945, and was employed with the New Brunswick Liquor Control Commission for thirty years. Retired in 1975 as an auditor.

In Masonic activities, he was raised to the degree of a Master Mason, in Zion Lodge No. 21, on the 14th of Dec. 1949. Worshipful Master 1961. Appointed District Deputy Grand Master, 1965-1966.

Exalted to the Holy Royal Arch Degree, in Sussex Chapter No. 9, 17th May, 1955.

Elected First Principal, 1964.

A member of Ivanhoe Preceptory No. 36, In Moncton, And a member of St. John Council No. t of Royal and Select Masters, In Saint John.

Most Excellent Companion Rogers, is a member of Trinity Anglican Church, in Sussex, of which he has been envelope secretary for the last fifteen years.

Held in the town of Chatham, N. B., in the Masonic Temple Saturday, October 29th, A. D. 1977, A. i. 2507

Notice of Motion

Ninety-first Annual Grand Convocation:— M. Ex. John H. Lingley gives notice of motion that he will move, or cause to be moved, that

Section 123 be added to the Constitution and General Regulations of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of New Brunswick, as follows:—

- Section 123 (1) There shall be established a fund to be known as "The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of New Brunswick Benevolent Fund".
 - (2) A committee composed of two Past Grand Z's, appointed annually by the First Grand Principal, one of whom shall be the Committee Chairman, together with the Grand Treasurer, shall have custody of the fund and be responsible for its investment, reinvestment and the distribution of its earnings.
 - (3) A separate bank account shall be established with the Regular Signing Officers of Grand Chapter being the Authorized Signing Officers.
 - (4) All monies received shall be deposited as Capital Funds and only the interest from these funds shall be used for charitable purposes.
 - (5) Contributions to this fund shall be made to the Grand Scribe E who shall issue receipts for same and transfer such monies to the Grand Treasurer for deposit in "The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of New Brunswick Benevolent Fund" Bank Account.
 - (6) Interest from monies paid into the fund shall be used for the following purposes:
 - (a) To provide required financial assistance for children under eighteen years of age, of deceased Royal Arch Companions, in whose estates sufficient money for these purposes does not exist.
 - (b) To provide assistance to distressed widows of deceased Royal Arch Companions.
 - (c) To assist the parent, parents, or guardian in the cost of caring for crippled or otherwise incapacitated children of both living and deceased Royal Arch Companions.
 - (d) To assist in the maintenance and relief of Royal Arch Companions or their widows who, through

illness, disability or other circumstances, shall require assistance.

- (7) All requests for assistance recommended by an interested Subordinate Chapter shall be forwarded to the Grand Scribe E under the seal of the Subordinate Chapter, accompanied by a statement of the circumstances which prompted the request for such assistance. Such requests shall be re-sub-mitted to the Committee Chairman who shall have the Committee take appropriate action in keeping with the circumstances and the availability of funds.
- (8) The financial records of the fund shall be audited annually by the Grand Chapter Auditors and an Audit Report submitted to the Annual Convocation of the Grand Chapter.
- (9) The Committee in control of the fund shall be required to furnish a written report to the Annual Convocation of Grand Chapter, keeping in mind the confidential aspect of the committee's activities.

M. Ex. Larry E. Bayley gives notice of motion that he will move, or cause to be moved, that the Constitution and General Regulations of Grand Chapter be ammended in regard to the Duties of the Grand Scribe "E", Page 13, Sec. 36, commencing at line 9, which reads: "shall collect the revenue of Grand Chapter" be deleted, substituting the following: "shall receive all monies of or belonging to Grand Chapter from what-so-ever source(s) and for what-so-ever purpose (s) and pay them promptly (without delay) to the Grand Treasurer, taking his receipt there-for, accompanied by a memorandum of distribution, in duplicate, one copy for the Grand Treasurer, retaining the other copy, same to be submitted with all Bills, Vouchers, fully completed Statements and Books closed off as of May 15th, together with the Annual Returns received from each subordinate Chapter, to the Audit Committee appointed by the Executive Committee in each year.

Boutilier gives notice of motion that he will move, or cause to be moved, that Sec. 108 of the Constitution and General Regulations of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of New Brunswick, item 6 thereof, be ammended to read:— "For every Companion exalted in Chapter, to include registration and certificate, \$5.00"

and Item 10 thereof be ammended to read:— "Annually, for every member of a Constituent Chapter (Including honorary members).... \$2.50."

The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of New Brunswick assembled for the Ninety-first Annual Convocation in the Masonic Temple, Chatham, N. B. on Saturday, June 17th, 1978. The Companions having assembled, the Grand Principals entered, assumed their stations and Grand Chapter was opened in ample form.

After a very warm welcome was extended by our First Grand Principal to our distinguished guests they were invited to seats in or near the East and Grand Honors were accorded.

The pedestal was then veiled and Most Worshipful Blake Oulton, The Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick entered accompanied by several Past First Grand Principals and Hon. Past First Grand Principals. He was introduced by V. Ex. Alan King.

M. Ex. Potter, First Grand Principal, extended the Grand Master a very cordial welcome, inviting him to the East where the gavet was presented and he was invited to preside. Most Worshipful

Brother Oulton brought greetings from the Grand Lodge to our Grand Convocation and after returning the gavel to M. Ex. Potter he was escorted out of the chapter room.

Councillor Waltace of the Town of Chatham was then Introduced by Ex. R. A. Prosser. Mr. Wallace was invited to the East where he brought greetings from the Mayor and citizens of Chatham. After which he was escorted out of the chapter room, the pedestal was unveiled and labour continued in ample form.

It was moved by M. Ex. W. Y. Leeman and seconded by M. Ex. R. D. Baird that the Grand Chapter recess at 12 o'clock noon, to resume at 2 p.m. with the first order of business at that time to be the election of officers. Carried.

At this time the presentation of the United States and Canadian flags by the two Grand Standard Bearers took place after which the companions joined in the singing of The Star Spangled Banner and O'Ganada.

Divine service leaflets having been distributed V. Ex. Hoddinott, A/Grand Chaplain, conducted our divine service. At the conclusion he was thanked by the First Grand Principal, moved by M. Ex. G. B. Pearson and seconded by M. Ex. J. M. Wilson that the A/Grand Chaplain's message be printed in the proceedings. Carried. Due to the absence of our Grand Organist, M. Ex. Frank Borlace, Grand First Principal of Quebec, graciously volunteered to fulfill his duties.

GRAND CHAPLAIN'S ADDRESS Most Excellent Sir: Distinguished Visitors: Companions:

I consider it a great privilege to conduct this devotional service here today and I should like to speak on the rather general theme of the place of Masonry in today's society. We may find it difficult to give a definition of present day society and perhaps even more difficult to define Masonry. Following the assasination of Senator Robert Kennedy, a columnist in an American paper wrote: "You do not live in a country anymore but in a cesspool. It does not happen anywhere the way it happens here. The country does not work anymore. All that money and power have produced is a bunch of people so filled with fear and hate that when a man tries to tell them they must do more for other men they shool him in the head." That was

an extreme case but it points up the dreadful fear that our present day society is in danger of falling to pieces at a time when we have material wealth and power and conveniences unparalled in the history of the world. There is in fact despair and gloom in the hearts of millions today. Older people are wondering whether present day society will hold together long enough to see them through, and many young people are unwilling to beget children because they are fearful of the kind of world into which their children would come.

Masonry has been defined as "a system of morally velled in allegory and illustrated in symbols." And a longer and clearer definition defines it as "the activity of closely united men, who employing symbolical forms borrowed largely from the mason's trade and from architecture, work to enoble themselves and others, and thereby to bring about a universal league of mankind, which they aspire even now to exhibit on a small scale."

Following the assasination of Dr. Martin Luther King we heard many times excerpts from an address he delivered sometime before his death under the title: "I Have A Dream". He knew that his dream was not near fulfillment. He knew that there must come yet much sorrow and many tears, but he still believed that someday his dream would come true. And Masonry has a great dream. It looks at a world of strife and fear and hate; a world which a typical writer calls a cesspool, and which we all know is seriously ill; and yet Masonry challenges us still to the task which confronts us as a part of a worldwide fratemity. In Thousands of Lodges throughout the world men are being summoned to five as brothers and friends and to practice friendship in all the tangled relationships of life.

A few years ago the late and lamented Senator Robert Kennedy delivered a speech in which he said this: "There is discrimination in this world and slavery and slaughter and starvation. Governments repress their people. Millions are trapped in poverty, while the nation grows rich and wealth is lavished on armaments everywhere. We must remember that all men are our brothers, that they share with us the same short moment of life, that they seek as we do nothing but the chance to live out their lives in purpose and happiness, winning what satisfaction and fulfillment they can."

And some few years before the Senator seld these words an English philosopher with a sad heart wrote this: "The life of man

is a long march through the night, surrounded by invisible foes, tortured by weariness and pain towards a goal that few can hope to reach and where none may terry long." His decision is one of despair, but his insistence that we are all pilgrims, that life for many could be unendurable, unless we stand ready to lavish upon them true friendship and understanding, comes very close to the philosophy of Masonry. For he concludes, "We must not weigh in grudging scales men's merits or de-merits, we must think only of their need and they are fellow travellers with us."

Of course the man whom I have just quoted could not have joined a Lodge of Masons. For he was a declared atheist and saw life only as the result of blind forces — no plan and no purpose. Masonry on the other hand sees the mind of an Architect and the hand of a Master Craftsman. Our only hope in the world today is that there is an Architect and Creator of all things, and that the structure which Masonry seeks to create is but the fulfillment here upon earth of that Grand Design which exists in His mind and which He has drawn upon the Treatle Board of life.

For masonry rests on our belief in a Supreme Power which is not ourselves, and that Power is on the side of truth and harmony and justice. That is why we cannot cease to work for a universal league of all mankind. Within the Lodge we may be isolated from the rushing world of men and events. We may have secret words and signs and symbols by means of which we recognize one another. But these things are not the essence of Masonry. The essence of Masonry is that which is represented by the letter "G". That unseen Power whose will for us and all men is good and whose divine purposes we have some share in working out and carrying through.

In England years ago before Xity was taken there missionaries of the Gospel tried hard to establish the teachings of one God. While a meeting of the head men of the community debated as to whether they should hear the strange men with a stranger religion, a little bird flew in through the window, tarried as if to warm itself and then flew out into the night. The old man arose and said: "The life of man is like that bird. We know not wither it came and whence it went. We come to the wise men and they cannot tell us. Our flight is brief. Therefore, if there be anyone who can tell us more about it then let us hear him."

Some years ago before my retirement I was minister of a church near which was buried many of the early settlers along this river. We were in the process of restoring the old cemetary. I was intrigued by some of the quaint and sometimes pathetic epitaphs carved often by hand upon stones marking the resting places of the dead. One stone — still standing — was a column executed from local stone. About five feet from the ground it appeared to have been broken and I supposed the missing part had disappeared. Then I discovered the symbolism of the broken stone. It was meant to have been in that form. For it said to all who would hear that life on earth is never the completed piece. There is more — "when we have shuffled off this mortal colt."

The traditional churches were usually built with long tapering spires. Not as adornments but as declarations of the faith that our destiny is beyond. Perhaps they were wrong in their geography, for we are not looking for a place. We are looking for a continuation — a survival. We seek the City of God. We journey towards a Celestial Lodge not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.

And what has Masonry to say? It does not argue. It does not dispute. It does not always reason. It shows us one dark tragedy of life In its darkest hour. It shows us treachery and cunning represented by those who sought by evil means and for selfish reasons to obtain the secrets of a Master Mason. It shows us that. But it shows us a brave man who stands up to that evil and dares to die but will not yield. And in his love for that truth he goes down into the night of death that virtue, truth and honesty might live and not perish from earth. Yet as that man matches the integrity of his soul against the dark brutish forces of evil and dies rather than yield that which he has sworn to preserve, there stands the ancient tale upon which we rest our hope of immortality. So that working as we do with hands that will soon be folded in death, yet in that night of death "hope sees a star, and listening love can hear the rustle of a wing."

When the roll call of officers took place all were present except the Grand Director of Ceremonies, Grand Chaplain, Grand Archivist, Grand Organist and the Grand District SuperIntendent No. 2.

When the reading of the minutes of the 90th Annual Convocation were called for it was moved by M. Ex. J. H. Lingley and seconded by M. Ex. R. T. Haley that the minutes as printed in the proceedings be adopted. Carried.

The Past First Grand Principals who answered when their names were called at this time are marked with an "X" in the list of Past First Grand Principals at the back of these proceedings.

Next was the roll call of Grand Representatives, the Grand Scribe "E" asked permission to have the Grand Scribe "N" call the names. Those responding are marked by an "X" in the list of Grand Representatives at the back of these proceedings.

The Grand Representatives were thanked for their presence and reminded of their very important role in Grand Chapter by the First Grand Principal.

First report from the credential committee is as follows:— Chapters represented 11; represented by First Principals 1; Sister Jurisdictions represented 7; Grand Chapter members 55; Companions 9; Visitors 11 for a total of 75.

The Grand "Z" then gave his report which follows hereunder:—

To the Officers and Companions of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of New Brunswick:—

It is my great privilege and pleasure to extend to each and everyone of you a most cordial welcome to this our 91st Annual Convocation of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of New Brunswick.

It is a great honor to have Grand Chapter meet here for the first time, and I should like to extend thanks to my Mother Chapter Mt. Lebanon No. 5 for their kind invitation to host us today.
