# BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH ERIC ERNEST CALDWELL First Grand Principal of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of New Brunswick

Eric Ernest Caldwell was born on December 25, 1928 at Three Mile Plains, Hants Co., N. S.

He is married to the former Edna Florence Pettigrew of Springhill, Cumberland Co., N. S.

They have one son and one daughter.

He graduated from Windsor Academy In 1946 and immediately entered the service of the Bank of Nova Scotla where he has been employed continuously since that time. His banking career has been spent completely in the Maritime Provinces. In 1954 he was appointed Accountant in Digby, N.S. and three years later was appointed Credit Officer at the Charlotte Street Branch, Saint John, N.B. One year later he was transferred to Crapaud, P.E.I. as Manager and still later, to Montague. In 1965 he was transferred back to New Brunswick as Manager at Petrocodiac and in 1971 assumed his present position as manager in St. Stephen.

Due to the nature of fils occupation, Most Excellent Companion Caldwell's Masonic career embraces the Maritime Provinces. He was raised a Master Mason in True Brothers Lodge No. 8, Crapaud, on December 9, 1951 and was elected Master of Victoria Lodge No. 26, St. Stephen in 1975.

He was exalted to the Holy Royal Arch Degree in Alexandra Chapter, Charlotte-town on May 2, 1963 and elected First Principal of St. Stephen Chapter No. 5. St. Stephen, N. B. in 1972 and was elected First Grand Principal in 1979. He completed the Crytic Rite Degrees on April 25, 1964 in Garden of the Gulf Council No. 9, Charlottetown and was elected Thrice Illustrious Master of Tantramar Council No. 8, Moncton in 1971. He was consecrated a Knight Templar on May 20, 1964 in Prince Edward Preceptory No. 35, Charlottetown and was elected Presiding Preceptor of Ivanhoe Preceptory No. 36, Moncton In 1989.

In addition to the foregoing, he was admitted a member of McLeod-Moore Conclave No. 1, Red Cross of Constantine and presently holds the office of Most Puissant Sovereign. He is also a member of Luxor Temple A.A.O.N.M.S., the Main Council of Annointed High Priests, the Past Officers Association of the State of Maine and Eastern Canada Priory No. 19, Knights of the York Cross of Honour.

Most Excellent Companion Caldwell is a Warden of the Anglican Parish of St. Stephen, a Diocesan Lay Reader and is enrolled in a course of study leading to ordination to the Supplementary Ministry of the Anglican Church of Canada.

He enjoys golfing and is a member of the Algonquin Golf Club, St. Andrews. N. B.

#### SPECIAL CONVOCATION

Held in the City of Bangor, Maine, U. S. A., in the Masonic Temple Saturday, October 28th, A. D. 1978, A. I. 2508.

The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of New Brunswick assembled in Joint Special Grand Chapter Convocation at the Masonic Temple in Bangor, Maine, U. S. A., as guest of the Grand Chapter of the Royal Arch Masons of that State.

At approximately 3:30 p.m., Mount Moriah Chapter No. 6 opened and M. Ex. Companion Marvin A. Timberlake, Grand High Priest of Maine was introduced, escorted to the East and presented the gavel and asked to preside.

M. Ex. Companion John A. Rogers, First Grand Principal of New Brunswick was then introduced and escorted to the East.

Also introduced were M. Ex. Companion Lane Wheaton, Past Grand High Priest of Massachusetts; M. Ex. Companion Emerson and M. Ex. On October 14th, 1978 M. Ex. (Hon.) Companion Canon N. Franchetti was honoured by a Special Grand Chapter Convocation on the occasion of his 100th birthday when the First Grand Principal made his official visit to Edmundston Chapter No. 10.

The First Principal, Ex. Companion A. D. Livingstone of the host Chapter welcomed Grand Chapter in due form and turned the gavel over to M. Ex. Companion John A. Rogers. The M. Ex. First Grand Principal then noted that M. Ex. (Hon.) Franchetti was celebrating the 100th anniversary of his birth, and read the record of his Masonic career. He extended congratulations to Canon Franchetti on behalf of Grand Chapter, following which several distinguished Companions and Companions of Edmundston Chapter spoke in glowing terms of M. Ex. Franchetti's Masonic career, his Church career and the good work he has accomplished in his community over the years.

M. Ex. Franchetti responded very fittingly to the honour which had been extended to him; and later in the banquet room enjoyed cutting a birthday cake specially made for the occasion.

Received his Entered Apprentice Degree on September 3rd, 1914; his Fellowcraft Degree on October 1st, 1914 and his Master Mason Degree on November 5th, 1914. Was Worshipful Master of his Lodge in 1932. Was made a Life Member of Bethel Lodge, Edmundston on December 27th, 1945; received his 50 year jewal on November 5th, 1964 and his 60 year bar in 1974.

Exalted as a Royal Arch Mason on October 3rd, 1921 and was High Priest of Edmundston Chapter No. 10 in 1922, 1923 and 1924. Received his 50 year lewel in 1971.

M Ex. (Hon.) Companion Franchettl was Grand Chaptain of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of New Brunswick in 1950, 1951, 1952, 1960, 1961, 1962, 1963 and 1964. Was given the title of Hon First Grand Principal on October 25th, 1975.

Was Grand Chaptain of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick in 1938 and 1945. Joined Supreme Council on July 5th, 1933; Royel Order of Scotland on January 10th, 1946. Received his A.& A. S. R. 50 year jewel in June 1977. Joined the A.A. Order of the Mystic Shrine on June 18th, 1924.

#### Exodus Chapter 3:1-14 and Chapter 4:1-7

Companions, I shall attempt in the next few moments at our disposal, to direct your thoughts to some of the great truths contained in these portions of scripture.

It is not my purpose to attempt to explain the burning bush. Suffice to say, it is one of God's miracles and portrays His incomprehensible power.

God was there and revealed His holiness.

This was God's way of attracting Moses' attention. When Moses turned aside to see the burning bush, God spoke to him, and revealed His great plan to free the children of Israel.

God revealed Himself in a very personal way as He spoke to Moses when He said, "I AM."

Companions, let us always be ready to recognize our "Burning Bush," God's attempt to get our attention.

Let us turn aside with reverence. "The place whereon thou standest is Holy Ground," Moses was told.

We need to learn anew what Holy Ground is. That place where

our attention is arrested by God is for us a Holy Place. There God would meet with us and speak with us.

These verses of Chapter 4 that were read should be familiar to to all Hoyal Arch Masons.

When Moses began to make excuses why he could not do this great work, God said unto him, "What is that in thy hand?" and he said, "A rod." God said, "Cast it on the ground," and it became a serpent, and Moses fled from before it.

In verse four, God said unto Moses, "Put forth thy hand, and take it by the tail," and he put forth his hand, and caught it, and it became a rod in his hand again.

We learn from these verses what God could do when Moses committed himself and his rod to Him.

Let us turn aside to hear God speak to us in His Word.

Companions, I would challenge you to turn aside and learn how God would work through you, and to commit your lives, your talents, and your goods to Him.

On behalf of your Executive Committee, I beg leave to submit the following report for the past year. Four meetings were held as follows:

#### ST. STEPHEN, N. B. - AUGUST 27, 1978

The Secretary reported on his findings relative to Grand Representatives and their duties. ROYAL ARCH MASONS date from the year the second temple was commenced by Zerubbabel, ANNO INVENTIONIS (A.I.), "in the year of the discovery".

**ROYAL AND SELECT MASTERS** date from the year in which the temple of Solomon was completed, ANNIO DEPOSITIONIS (A.DEP.), "In the year of the deposit".

KNIGHTS TEMPLARS commenced their era with the organization of their Order, ANNIO ORDINUS (A.O.), "in the year of the Order".

ORDER OF HIGH PRIESTHOOD dates from the year of the blessing of Abraham by the High Priest Melchizedek. ANNIO BENEFACTO (A.B.), "in the year of the blessing".

SCOTTISH RITE, same as Ancient Craft, except the Jewish chronology is used, ANNIO MUNDI (A.M.). "in the year of the world".

## RULES FOR MASONIC DATES

#### ANCIENT CRAFT MASONS

Add 4000 years to the common era. Thus 1979 and 4000-5979.

#### ROYAL ARCH MASONS

Add 530 years to the vulgar era. Thus: 1979 and 530—2509.

#### ROYAL AND SELECT MASTERS

Add 1000 to the common era. Thus: 1979 and 1000-2979.

#### KNIGHTS TEMPLARS

From the Christian era take 1118. Thus: 1118 from 1979-861.

#### ORDER OF HIGH PRIESTHOOD

Add 1913 to the common era. Thus: 1979 and 1913—3892.

#### SCOTTISH RITE

Add 3760 to the common era. Thus: 1979 and 3760—5739. After September add another year.
