#### SPECIAL CONVOCATION

Held in the City of Bangor, Maine, U.S.A. at the Masonic Temple, Saturday, October 22nd, A.D. 1988, A.I. 2518

The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of New Brunswick assembled In joint Special Grand Convocation with the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Maine, at the Masonic Temple, Bangor, on the date stated.

Chapter was opened at 3:00 p.m. by Mount Morlah Chapter No. 6 after which the Grand Officers of both jurisdictions entered and formed up on both sides of the Altar, M. Ex. Harold E. Birt, Grand High Priest of Maine and M. Ex. Calvin H. Griffith, First Grand Principal of New Brunswick were escorted to the East where they were accorded Grand Honours.

M. Ex. Waldo Y. Leeman and M. Ex. Charles S. Brown were then called upon to introduce the Grand Chapter Officers and Past Grand Chapter Officers assembled. In the lines were several Grand Chapter Companions from other jurisdictions.

# The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of New Brunswick ONE HUNDRED AND SECOND ANNUAL CONVOCATION held in the Masonic Half, Saint John West, N.B. June 17th, A.D. 1989, A.I. 2519

The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of New Brunswick assembled for the One Hundred and second Annual Convocation in the Masonic Hall, Saint John West, N.B. on Saturday, June 17th, 1989. The Companions having assembled, the Grand Scribe "E" announced to the Grand Pursuivant that a constitutional number of Chapters were present. The Grand Pursuivant gave the knocks at the door, the Grand Principals entered and assumed their stations and Grand Chapter was opened in Amole Form.

A very warm welcome was extended to these representatives of concordant bodies by M. Ex. C.H. Griffith, First Grand Principal.

The Grand Scribe "E" was directed at this time to read the proclamation of the One Hundred and Second Convocation.

It was moved by M. Ex. John A. Amold, seconded by V. Ex. Fred Healey that this Grand Chapter recess at 12 o'clock noon, to resume at 2 p.m. with the first order of business at that time to be the final report from the credentials committee and then the election of officers. Motion carried.

The presentation of the United States and Canadian flags by the two Standard Bearers took place at the Aftar. After each flag was placed in its standard in the "East", we all joined in the singing of the "Star Spangled Banner" and "O'Canada". The two Grand Standard Bearers were V. Ex. M.A. Milchell and Rt. Ex. D. Cornfield (acting).

Ex. Companion Rick Curtis on behalf of Union Chapter No. 4, now wetcomed everyone to Saint John and stated how pleased they were to host this One Hundred and Second Grand Chapter Convocation.

At this time it was announced that the Grand Master of Masons for New Brunswick, Most Worshipful Brother Charles Hollett was in waiting, the pedestal was veiled and the Most Worshipful, The Grand Master was introduced at the Alter by M. Ex. James M. Wilson, walcomed by the first Grand Principal, M. Ex. Calvin Grifflith who had the Grand Master conducted to the East, given grand honours and then passed his gavel over to him. Most Worshipful Brother Hollett favoured us with a very informative and interesting address and then turned the meeting back to M. Ex. Griffith. When asked if he would like to remain he said he would like to stay and would join us for

uncheon.

It was then announced that a representative from the City of Saint John was without and the pedestal already being velted, Patricia Landers representing Her Worship Mayor Elsie Wayne was introduced by M. Ex. Roy Carleton, given a warm welcome by our First Grand Principal and was conducted to the East where she gave an Official Welcome to the City and spoke on how pleased she was to have been chosen to carry out this duty as she found the whole thing fascinating and very colourful. Following her remarks she was then escorted out of the chapter room to a round of applicate.

Divine Service leaflets had been distributed and at this time the First Grand Principal called on M. Ex. E.E. Caldwell to conduct our Divine Service. At the conclusion he was thanked by the First Grand Principal and it was moved by M. Ex. James Wilson, seconded by V. Ex. Arnold Cross that the Grand Chaplain's message be printed in full in the proceedings. Motion carried.

#### THE MAN WHO MAKES NO MISTAKES -- AND NOTHING ELSE

My text this morning is found in St. Luke's Gospel, chapter 15 and verse 29 reading as follows: "Lo these many years do I serve thee, neither transgressed I at any time thy commandment." In the same train of thought, Proverbs Chapter 14 and verse four tells us: "Where no oxen are the crib is clean."

What we see here is a nice clean barn because there are no cattle to dirty it. Everything is spottess and in order — but it is producing nothing. Or we could took at a factory with gleaming machinery, heat shelves and immaculate floors because it is turning out nothing. To carry this a step further, we may think of a preacher whose grammar may not be perfect but his message is filled with hope, comfort, consolation and love. Again we may think of a presiding officer in any of our Masonic bodies who is trying his best and is not afraid of making a mistake and we contrast him with one who does little or nothing and thereby has no following.

My text is taken from the parable of The Prodigal Son. In this story Christ sets before us a lesson of worthlessness of negative perfection. Many of us, I am sure, look upon the elder son as a paragon of virtue but I doubt that Christ praises him. He probably sees him as a man who makes no mistakes because he doesn't try anything. He could not even find it in his heart to be gracious when his brother was restored to the tamily. And we have those in our society today. They will criticize and find fault with others but will do nothing themselves.

In this man, Christ brings before us three things:

- (1). A man with no great passions and therefore no deep repentances;
- (2). A man who has no great ideals and thus has no great failures;
- (3). A man with no great affections and therefore suffers no tragedies.

The elder brother stated: "Neither transgressed I at any time", and he was probably being truthful. His barn was clean. Admittedly the younger brother had made a mess out of things but he had at least shown some spirit, even though his efforts were misguided.

There are perhaps two lessons we should learn from this parable. First of all we should learn to be sympathetic toward an erring brother. We know what he has done but we don't know how much he has resisted. That doesn't relieve him of the gulft but it should make us less harsh in our judgement. Let us admit, we may be virtuous only because we have not been tempted. We may not have sinned because it has never paid us to do so. One writer has said: "We have been more interested in the selling of pigs than in living with pigs." And that may be the big difference between us and the prodigal son. The second lesson we should learn is that a life with no great passions is in danger of having no repentances. If we have never committed a sin openly, we may be tuiled into thinking we have never sinned at all and we know that this is not the case. All have sinned and all need repentance and Christ died for sinful mankind.

Secondly we look at the man who has made no mistakes. He aspires to nothing so there is little danger of failure. There are times when we must take a risk if we are to succeed at all. And especially we must be careful as to whether we measure our aims and successes by worldly or by spiritual standards. One may achieve worldly success by underhanded means and come at the end to realize it was a shallow gain. Worldly wealth can never be taken with us when we depart this life but things of the spirit go with us into eternity.

This is the lesson of the elder brother. The horizon and the scope of the sympathies of his heart and soul were bounded by the size of his fields. His life was a success by worldly standards but a dismal failure by those of God. It would have been better for him to have gone into the far country like his brother, if by so doing he could have discovered his own soul.

And then, the third thing we notice in the person who makes no mistakes is his tack of affection. He has no tragedies because he has little heart. Consider how the elder brother received his long lost brother. He was angry and totally tacking in sympathy. He would not even go in to the party. He complained he had never been given a fatted call to make merry with his friends. Quite probably he may not have had too many friends in any case because he tacked the capacity to win them. Such a life has little possibility of tragedy in it because it takes no risks and therefore is unlikely to have any great losses. Sometimes the losses we suffer are what strengthens the soul. If from our sorrows, we build a life that is rich in sympathy, then those sorrows will indeed rapay us grandly. Like the young prodigal, we may not have an earthly inheritance but we will have a Heavenly Fathar's love, a welcome home and a teast in our hondur.

So let us summarize the threefold lesson of our text. The elder brother's

condemnation was due to the negative word "not". He was not anything, neither good or bad. He may not have done much evil but by the same token he did nothing much that was good. Christ, I am sure, has little regard for negative goodness. We remember how He once said: "Inasmuch as ye did it not unto one of these, the least of my brethren, ye did it not unto Me."

And now let us apply these lessons to our own lives - to our personal lives and our lives within our Masonic bodies. Even though there may be no great open sins in our lives, if there is no great love, no deep repentance, no compassion, we may be far off from the love of God. Remember that God doesn't fudge by outward appearances but by the heart and to Him the heart that has no deep need of Himself has no attraction. I do not, for a moment suggest that in any aspect of our life we should do things treationally but there are times when like the young prodigal, we have to venture out into the unknown. Christ told the fishermen to launch out into the deep. They had toiled all night and had caught nothing, yet, by an act of faith they cast their nets and caught a draught of lish so large that their nets began to break. And in like manner, in our lodges and chapters we have to launch out by faith. It may be the matter of taking an office involving responsibility, or in adopting some special project, or in assisting some companion who is in need materially or spiritually. We may not always succeed but if we try, we will be rewarded. To those who come back from the far country, like the prodigal son, with tears on their faces and repentance in their voices and manner, we will be able to hear the words: "Thy sins which are many are forgiven. Go in peace thy faith has saved thee." "Well done, good and faithful servant. Enter thou into the loy of thy Lord."

Most Excellent Calvin Griffith, First Grand Principal then called for the roll call of officers by the Grand Scribe "E". All were present except the Grand Historian and the Grand Standard Bearer No. 2.

When the reading of the minutes of the One Hundred and First Annual Convention were called for, it was moved by M. Ex. M.F. Eagles, seconded by M. Ex. W.Y. Leeman that the minutes as printed in the proceedings be adopted. Motion carried.

The first report of the credentials committee is as follows: Chapters represented 19; Grand Chapter members 60; companions 4; visitors 16; total: 80.

As in past years a collection was taken for the Benevolent fund, this total was \$144.00 and was passed over to the Grand Treasurer.

The Past First Grand Principals who answered when their names were called are marked with an "X" in the list of Past First Grand Principals at the back of these proceedings. A warm welcome was extended by the First Grand Principal and response was given by M. Ex. J.M. Wilson who invited M. Ex. Calvin H. Griffith to join their ranks when this Grand Chapter Convocation was ended.

Next was the roll call of Grand Representatives. The Grand Scribe "E" asked permission to have the Grand Scribe "N" call the names, those responding are marked with an "X" in the list of Grand Representatives at the back of these proceedings. The Grand Representatives were thanked for their attendance by the First Grand Principal and reminded of their very important role in Grand Chapter. The response was given by V. Ex. Donald Fisher

The next order of business was the report by R. Ex. Raiph A. Prosser, president of the Executive Committee: included is a summary of the Grand District Superintendent's reports:

## REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE GRAND CHAPTER OF ROYAL ARCH MASONS OF NEW BRUNSWICK

To the Most Excellent First Grand Principal, Officers and Companions of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of New Brunswick:

On behalf of the Executive Committee, I submit the following report for the past year.

We held two meetings as follows: The first was held in Salisbury, N.B. on September 3rd, 1988.

The President called the meeting to order at 2:00 p.m. with a prayer by M. Ex. Lingley. A minute's silence was observed in memory of V. Ex. Fred Phillips, Fredericton Chapter No. 2 who died on July 5th, 1988.

The first Item of business was to elect a Vice-President, MOTION that R. Ex. MacFarland be appointed to this office, CARRIED.

A copy of the minutes of the Executive meeting held on April 16th, 1988 was sent to all members. MOTION that they be adopted, CARRIED.

M. Ex. Wilson gave a brief review on the fast transactions of the Centennial Committee. M. Ex. Jeffries turned over the remaining jewels and bumper stickers to Grand Chapter, thus closing out our Centennial Year. M. Ex. Wilson, Gr. Treasurer gave his unaudited report of Grand Chapter accounts as of September 3rd, 1988 as follows:
